Lisa Wainwright

A Personal Mission to Reduce Redundancy Inspires Innovation

Lisa Wainwright has devoted her NRCS career to helping farmers and her colleagues. For 10 years, Lisa worked as a soil conservation technician in eight counties across Kansas before settling in Wabaunsee County, in 2021 as a district conservationist.

Eastern Kansas is where Lisa grew up and where her love for the land and animals began. Her lifelong passion for horses and other livestock led her to Kansas State University, where she earned a degree in animal science. And Lisa hasn't stopped learning and striving to meet her career aspirations.

"Seven years into my career with NRCS, I went back to school to get a few more hours of credit to be eligible to move up in the agency," says Lisa. "I am not sure where I want to go, but I am growing by taking details and participating in leadership programs and projects that expose me to so many more aspects of the agency."

One challenge Lisa consistently found during her career explorations was a lack of institutional knowledge sharing.

"There are so many people that look to other states as resources for information or tools that their own state does not yet utilize," says Lisa. "There wasn't a place to share that knowledge."
